
The Magnificat

Invitation into a Beautiful Advent

Happy New Year. Well, happy Liturgical New Year because the first Sunday of Advent is the first Sunday of our Liturgical calendar.



It seems fitting to begin our Liturgical year during Advent; because Advent is a season of laying down the old and taking up the new. New commitments, in many forms, that align us more fully with the Holy Spirit so that we can feel the presence of God moving, soothing, and shaping our hearts and lives.

Advent invites us into a deeper spiritual relationship with Christ.

It **beckons** us into this "set aside time" in our church calendar; a time that is specifically honored in our sacred tradition to allow us **space** to prepare our hearts for the coming, once again, of our Savior on Christmas morning.

We are meant to become just a little bit uncomfortable with ourselves; so that we can listen closely to what the Holy Spirit is saying to us.

And to become comfortable enough with our uncomfortableness to step into a deeper **relationship centered experience with the one who adores us** as we awaken our spiritual wonderings during Advent.

These are the things we really want.

Unfortunately, it seems that the season of turning inward to create holy space is complicated by this material season of unholy busyness that is the result of modern life this time of year.

Before becoming a priest, I worked for seven at Holy Cross Episcopal Church as the Music Minister, Director of Christian Education, Children's Minister, and Family Life Minister. One Advent, I came up with a precious idea for the children.

On the first Sunday of Advent, I put the empty creche up on the altar. Then I hid several nativity figures around the Nave. When the children came from back Children's Chapel during the Peace, we played "Advent Hide and Seek". They ran all through Nave trying to find the characters. It was the cutest thing you've ever seen! Then when they found the donkey, a shepherd, a sheep, they would get to go up to the altar area and place it in the Creche.

So, over the course of the month of Advent, Sunday after Sunday, we began to have our little Nativity scene built before our eyes. Finally on the Sunday before Christmas all of the characters were in the Nativity scene except for Baby Jesus. We were all anxiously awaiting his arrival on Christmas Eve.

A couple of days before Christmas I was getting ready for our three Christmas services, I was rushing around the church trying to get everything perfect, I felt so stressed. At that moment I didn't even know if I liked Christmas anymore! Sound familiar?

As I was rushing past the altar, something whispered to my heart, "Stop".

The Nave suddenly seemed very quiet.

I looked down and saw our little Nativity scene that the children had built sitting on the altar and I walked over to it. I stood there looking down at it. Now remember, the children had 'built' it over the past four Sundays, so the characters were NOT all neatly lined up. They all seemed to be jumbling together in a big mess. An adorable mess, but a mess nonetheless.

But as I was looking down at it, I suddenly saw something beautiful.

Remember, no one had told these children how to place the characters that they found. And yet, instinctively, each Nativity character was placed looking inward. They had formed this little circle of anticipation. And right there in the middle was this little open place waiting for Jesus. This little spot that the children had left to place Baby Jesus in.

When I saw this little circle of hope that the children had created, I just stood there and cried like a baby. In their simple and unrehearsed way, they showed me the true meaning of Advent. These children believed that Jesus was coming, and they instinctively knew that they had to make space for him.


Jesus said, "Truly I tell you, unless you change and become like children, you will never enter the Kingdom of heaven." *Mathew* 18-3.

This Advent let US make holy space for our Lord; let us embrace this hope, like those little children, that if we leave a sacred space for Jesus; he will surely enter in.






