In Celebration

This month we will celebrate the retirement of Dr. Carol Culton as choir director and organist at St Mary's for 20 years. It is an incredible accomplishment to serve a faith community for that length of time! Carol has served with dedication and passion in her ministry, honoring music as a way to support the Worship Service.

I have been thinking about her incredible service to St Mary's as I work with others to plan her retirement celebration on Sunday, February 9th @ 10:00am during a special breakfast hour. We will have a beautiful breakfast sponsored by our ECW along with special music and gifts to celebrate her service. As I think about Carol's ministry at St Mary's I have been asking myself, "What is music?".

Music at its core is ordered sound. Silence, which is the absence of sound, creates the framework for which we experience this ordering. We know that God, in creation, is the source of all sound and silence. As the created cosmos was being ordered by its creator, the song of creation was recorded in Holy Scripture:

"Where were you when I laid the foundation of the earth? Tell me, if you have understanding. Who determined its measurements-surely you know! Or who stretched the line upon it? On what were its bases sunk, or who laid its cornerstone when the MORNING STARS SANG TOGETHER AND ALL THE HEAVENLY BEINGS SHOUTED FOR JOY?" Job 38:4-7.

The very first poem song that we see in the Bible is in Genesis 1, "When God began to create the heavens and the earth, the earth was complete chaos, and darkness covered the face of the deep, while a WIND FROM GOD swept over the face of the waters." Genesis 1:1-2. This first movement of the wind over the water is the first music that God sings over his earthy creation. During the days of creation, God directs the disordered rumble into ordered measure. And as the days of creation progress, we see the expression of God's divine creative sound. The light dispelling darkness, the dome of separation cradling the earth like a mother singing to her newborn baby, water swooshing across the dry land, trees unfurling their leaves reaching branches in praise of their creator, the songs of the creatures, human voices; and finally, God resting, the blessing of silence.

The earliest recorded scripture, "The Song of the Sea", is a prayer set to music. Miriam sings, "Sing to the Lord, for he has triumphed gloriously; horse and rider he has thrown into the sea" (Exodus 15:20-21). The second oldest written Biblical passage is also a song; The Song of Deborah, "Awake, awake, Deborah! Awake, awake, utter a song!" (Judges 5:12). In fact, the three oldest scriptures in the Bible are all believed to be songs!

Music connects us to God and allows us to experience God's nature and spirit in a uniquely intimate way. Music allows us to enter worship; to be lifted beyond this earthy realm and connect with the being of God. Since we know that all things divine, including music, comes from the creator, we experience music as a way to become immersed in the beauty of God's holiness. We bypass our mind and connect to the eternal part of our being; the part that sings with stars and worships with the wind.

May our hearts be grateful for the Ministry of Carol as we celebrate her gift of music. And may we continue to celebrate all of the creative powers of our God through music as we approach his throne of Grace each Sunday at St Mary's.

The 3rd Sunday of each month the Episcopal Church Women, and the St. Mary's Men's group will meet between services, in the hall (10:10am).




