## News from your Vestry

The Shoppe: Since the closure on July 17, the vestry has been in a time of discernment regarding the path forward, looking at the many aspects of the operation of the Shoppe. Bishop Russell brought in Deacon Pratt Paterson, a church business professional, to help the vestry examine the past operation and the feasibility of it going forward. The vestry decided on September 17 that the operation of a resale shop in the Allen House is not the best use of our resources of space and volunteers. Bishop Russell and Deacon Pratt agreed with that vestry decision. We will be moving forward soon with a plan for the remaining contents of the Shoppe.

The Allen House: So that brings us to a discussion of the best usage of this property. There have been suggestions of using it for various ministries such as a space for food pantry, children and youth programs, or a place to start a new ministry. Unfortunately, those programs would be a financial drain on the church as we would still have the expenses of insurance, utilities and upkeep. The vestry is committed to having any future usage of the house be financially sustainable, paying all the expenses and making some revenue for the church. The vestry is still in a period of discernment about the future usage. Two of the ideas so far are, 1. operating a music school and 2. renting the building. Fortunately, during this time, there is about \$8,000 in the Shoppe account that supports the operating costs of the house.
